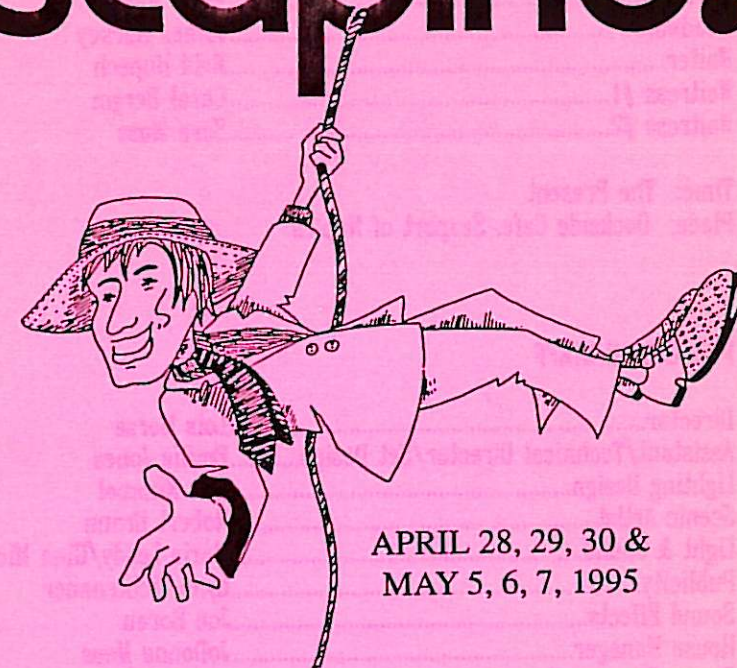

This comic madness, inspired by Moliere's *Les Fourberies de Scapin* ("Scapin: The Double Dealer") is set in Naples and begins with a song made up from the menu of an Italian restaurant. In spite of this and other references to modern America, the script is for the most part taken word-for-word from the French original. The play first opened in Paris in May of 1671. This translation by Frank Dunlap and Jim Dale was made for the Young Vic Theatre Troupe in 1953 at Oxford and played on Broadway in 1975-77.

The audience is a very important part of *"Scapino"*. You, the audience, will be asked to be a part of the action at times. We want you to feel like you are really sitting in a dock-side cafe in Naples. We invite you to join us in all our fun and sing with us the chorus of our song:

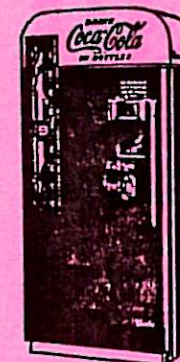
Minestrone, macaroni
